5th Grade Summer Reading

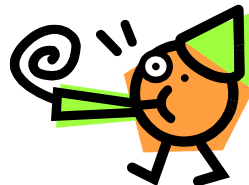
The students will have to read two books, from the provided list this summer, and must choose one from each column (Fiction and Nonfiction). The students will be able to take their AR quizzes the first week back after vacation or at home after they complete the book (within 48 hours of finishing the book is best). The students must write one book report and one visual project, it is up to each student which book they choose for each project. The book report must follow the provided rubric and contain the following:

- Title
- Author
- Characterization (*who/what is the story about? Tell me what kind of personality they have*)
- Setting (*what time in history, where the story took place, weather, any information than puts a picture in the reader's head*)
- Summary of the story in chronological order (*main events*)
- Did you like or dislike this book? Why?
- Attach rubric to back of report (last page)

For their visual project the students may be as creative as they want and should explore new ideas. Some suggestions for their visual project are:

- diorama
- poster
- movie trailer (iMovie, device video)
- Power Point presentation
- podcast book review
- write a song and make a music video
